

Easter Egg Suncatchers



You will need:

- Colored tissue paper, ripped or cut into small pieces
- Contact paper
- Ribbon or twine
- Hole punch
- Scissors

Instructions:

1. Cut your contact paper into two identically-sized sheets per egg.
2. Lay the first sheet of contact paper flat on a table, and peel away the backing so that the adhesive side is facing up. (Pro tip: Try using pieces of masking tape on the back of the contact paper to hold it flat on the table.)
3. Stick pieces of tissue paper to the contact paper — the more colorful the better! It is ok if the pieces overlap or go over the edges, as that will help your egg to look more colorful.
4. Once you have covered the contact paper, remove the backing from the second sheet of contact paper and place it on top of the tissue paper collage with the adhesive side facing down.
5. Press firmly together to seal the contact paper and tissue paper collage.
6. Cut your collage into egg shapes. You may choose to draw the egg shapes onto the contact paper before drawing, or you may freehand them.
7. Punch a hole near the top of your egg, and loop a piece of twine or ribbon through the hole.
8. Proudly display your Easter egg in a window!

Variations:

1. Try cutting the tissue paper into different shapes, or using longer pieces to create the appearance of stripes on your egg.
2. Add colorful sequins, feathers, or small beads to your egg before sealing it with the second sheet of tissue paper.
