

Windham Parks & Trails Bingo

- Visit one or more of the many parks, preserves, and trails around Windham.
- As you explore the natural places in Windham, try to observe plants and wildlife around you. Fill in the activities below as you complete them.
- 5 in a row across, down, or diagonally earns a Bingo! You get to decide what reward is best for your family once you've earned a Bingo. You can even try to complete all of the activities and earn a blackout!
- Please remember to observe proper social distancing guidelines while playing Bingo: travel only with immediate family, allow at least 6 feet of distance between groups of people, and visit another location if your first choice park is already full.



Ride a bike outside (or on a trail!) for at least 30 minutes.	Use an acorn cap or a blade of grass as a whistle.	Spot an insect. Can you tell what type of insect it is?	Create a nature collage from materials found outdoors.	Count how many different types of plants you see on one trail.
Choose a favorite park or trail in Windham, and tell someone why it is your favorite.	Visit a new trail!	Take a photo of a beautiful outdoor location.	Learn where Lowell Preserve got its name.	Have a picnic at one of the parks.
Find evidence of wildlife. (Perhaps scat, footprints, or impact on plants and trees.)	Draw a picture of something you've seen at one of the parks or trails.	 FREE SPACE	Visit the same location two different times. What has changed since you last visited?	Find a flower and determine what type it is.
Learn the name of the pond at Lippman Park.	Identify a tree: looking at the leaves and the bark, what kind of tree is this?	Watch the clouds for 10 minutes and find one that looks like an animal.	Spot a bird and try to imitate its call.	Learn at least 2 towns through which the Mountain Division Trail travels.
Complete an outdoor scavenger hunt.	Watch an animal in its natural habitat. What type of animal did you observe?	Do a leaf or bark rubbing craft activity.	Go for a 30-minute walk or hike.	Visit the park, trail, or preserve that is closest to your home.
